

## MAHLZEITEN: ZWEITES FRÜHSTÜCK

meal: die Mahlzeit, die Mahlzeiten  
 breakfast: das Frühstück, die Frühstücke  
 second breakfast: zweites Frühstück



Stalls advertising Bratwurst, Pommes-frites (chips; Chips in German means potato crisps) and perhaps Schaschlik or Gulaschsuppe, are found in every German town. These stalls reflect local tastes very markedly; in Munich they

could be selling Weißwurst or Würstl (southern German dialect for Würstchen or kleine Wurst) mit Senf, or Leberkäse, which is not a cheese but a kind of meat loaf. In other places Erbsensuppe or Brezeln may be found.

Sausages are eaten hot and with mustard, and with it, one eats a slice of bread or a roll. At the sports arena or at the station, one often sees vendors with hot sausages. They call out: "Hot Sausages! Hot! Hot!"
