Fritzlar's appearance hasn't changed for centuries. Timber frame houses, narrow lanes and loving details everywhere. Between them, small restaurants, ice cream parlors and cafes – an idyllic, tranquil atmosphere. The jewel in this Hessian town's crown is the old market square, a glorious ensemble of individually configured timber frame houses.

Monschau



Monschau is called the “Pearl of the Eifel” because of its rich cultural treasures. In the old town center, quaint timber frame houses alternate with magnificent dwellings. There are some 300 historically listed buildings. The facades along the narrow cobblestone lanes hide small art galleries and boutiques.
